Background Information

In May 2009 the Stephan G. Stephansson Icelandic Society was approached by Barry and Vivian Cook who indicated an interest in establishing a Scholarship Fund for graduating students from Spruce View School. Barry approached the Stephan G. Stephansson Icelandic Society to partner with him to administer the fund. Our Society was pleased to participate and partner in this worthwhile project to educate students about Icelandic culture.

About Mr. Cook

Mr. Cook is a management consultant by profession and lives in Vancouver. His family roots are Icelandic, going back to 1888, from the Markerville/Spruce View area. He completed most of his schooling in Dickson and subsequently obtained degrees from the Haskyne School of Business at the University of Calgary and the Sauder School of Business at the University of British Columbia.

The Cook Family Scholarship Fund was established in 2009. Successful applicants who graduated from the Spruce View School have been awarded scholarships through the Cook Family Scholarship to financially support post-secondary education. Commencing with the 2014/2015 school year, the eligibility criteria expanded to include graduating children of current SGSIS members.

Scholarship Information

Amount of the scholarship is \$2,000.00. If there are 2 equally deserving applicants in a year, 2 scholarships of 1,000.00 will be paid.

Eligibility:

- Students graduating from Grade 12 and are enrolled at a recognized post-secondary institution in a full-time degree or diploma program (minimum 2 years) may apply provided that:
 - The applicant is graduating from Spruce View School OR
 - The applicant is the child of a current SGSIS member graduating from another school.

The scholarship will be awarded on the basis of the following 3 criteria:

- The applicant's scholastic attainment.
- The applicant's development and submission of an essay of up to 1500 words as outlined in the two themes.
- Attention to spelling, grammar, flow of ideas and accuracy of historical references, and citation of resources used.

The essay submitted must focus on one of the following 2 themes:

- Using supportive examples, demonstrate how Markerville's Icelandic influence, either past or present, has impacted Markerville and its neighbouring communities.
- Using supportive examples, demonstrate how (where?) the Stephan G. Stephansson Icelandic Society has impacted the Hamlet of Markerville, its neighbouring communities and the County of Red Deer.

Supportive examples in the essay could be legacy, cultural, community and/or economic.

SUBMISSION DEADLINE: First Friday in May of each year.
